Congratulations to everyone who competed in 2023, and especially to our Regional and National leaderboard rider-horse pairs and equine Breed Performance Award winners. We are so thankful you chose Working Equitation as your sport, and we love having the opportunity to celebrate you and your equine partners. National Award Details

Our National High Point and National Reserve High Point Leaderboard winners in each division and performance level received an email in February with information that will allow each winner to select their choice of a USAWE branded embroidered item directly from our awards vendor. National Award orders must be processed by February 29, 2024, and we expect them to ship late-March. 


Biddie's donation was made because she "wanted to support the development fund as I know a lot of kids don't have the money to go to clinics or shows."

HORSE RECORDING COMMITTEE REPORT

Mindy Finelli, Horse Recording Committee Chair

All horses competing in any USAWE recognized competitions must be recorded with USAWE. The recording fee is \$30 and is valid for the LIFETIME of the horse. Before submitting a new registration for your horse, check here to make sure the horse doesn't already have a USAWE number!

OWNERSHIP TRANSFER - Horse recordings are transferable upon the sale of the horse at no charge; simply <u>CLICK HERE</u> to notify us of the transfer ownership. Also use this link to notify us if your equine partner is retired or deceased.

BREED REGISTRY - Certain breed awards (i.e., APHA, AQHA, BLM, IALHA, RMHA, etc.) require breed registry; however, a horse does not have to be registered with a breed registry to be recorded with USAWE. If your horse is registered with a breed registry, please ensure we have accurate breed registry number, pedigree, breeder and horse owner information on file. Send proof of breed registry(s) to HorseRecording@uswe.org.

HORSE RECORDING CHANGES - CLICK HERE to request a Horse Recording change, please fill out ONE form for EACH of your horse(s) to correct any ERRORS or to UPDATE your horse's record. Your assistance ensures USAWE Horse Recording database accuracy.

Communing with Cowgirls: USAWE's Robin Bond Shared her WE Expertise at Art of the Cowgirl Event in Arizona By Virginia Aulin

Robin Bond, Director At Large for USAWE, first attended Art of the Cowgirl two years ago and, at the 2024 event, held Jan. 17-21 in Queen Creek, Arizona, she led an eight-hour clinic:

Working Equitation – a Different Kind of Ranch Horse. Of all the clinics offered, hers was one of the best attended.

Art of the Cowgirl is dedicated to celebrating and honoring the contributions of women to the culture and legacy of the west.

Robin thought that having a USAWE presence at the annual event would be fun for American cowgirls to experience because both groups have a common ancestry – and share similar demographics.

"Art of the Cowgirls' demographics include women over 40 years old who have a little time and have made a little money and want to keep riding. They go to Art of the Cowgirl and watch the All-Girl Rodeo and the World's Greatest Horsewomen Contest and think it's very neat. But they also think, 'I can't ride like that anymore. I don't want to go 39 miles per hour to rope a calf. I don't want to go so hard. But I do want to keep riding and learning," Robin says.

Some important takeaways from Linda, Marie, and Cyndi were:

- Straightness is Important- not just close but STRAIGHT!
- Shoulder -in and Shoulder-fore are vital tools for straightness and performing movements correctly.
- Prepare for every part of the next maneuver. If you and your horse are not properly
 prepared, the movement will be poorly executed.
- While training, if horse anticipates abandon the maneuver and start again.
- Make sure horse is round before asking for a transition. Ex: Round before Rein back.
- Horses and Riders need to be physically fit. Establish a good conditioning program for you and your horse.
- 90% training is the dressage maneuver, 10% is schooling the obstacle.
- Halt aid: Seat, legs, hands. Don't pull reins.
- SHORT REINS- SOFT CONTACT.
